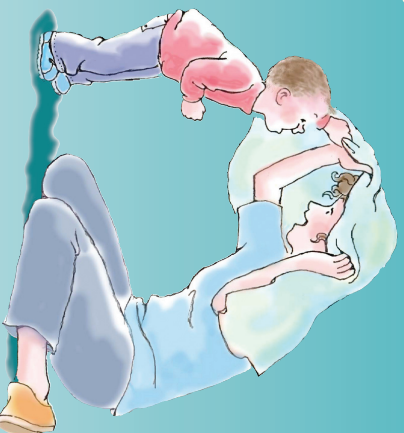

About the It Takes Two to Talk[®] Program

It Takes Two to Talk is a program for parents of children (birth to 5) who have language delays.

It Takes Two to Talk recognizes:

- the importance of involving parents in their child's early language intervention
- the need to help children and families as early as possible in a child's life

This evidence-based program, which was developed by The Hanen Centre, is well-known around the world. Studies on the *It Takes Two to Talk* Program have shown that it is effective and that, when parents learn to use the program's strategies, their children's communication skills improve.

It Takes Two to Talk is led by a Hanen Certified Speech-Language Pathologist/Therapist who has received specialized training from The Hanen Centre.



Why Parents are Involved in the It Takes Two to Talk Program

Parents are the most important people in their child's life. One of the greatest gifts parents can give their child is the help he or she needs to communicate and connect with the world. In the *It Takes Two to Talk* Program, you learn practical and powerful strategies to help your child communicate and interact during everyday routines and activities. It is within these familiar, real-life interactions with you that your child's communication skills will grow.

What Parents Learn in the It Takes Two to Talk Program

- how your child communicates right now and the next steps to take
- what motivates your child to communicate
- how to engage your child in back and forth conversations, even before he can talk
- how to turn everyday activities into opportunities for your child to learn language
- how to fine-tune what you say so your child can understand you and learn new words and ideas

What the *It Takes Two to Talk* Program Offers

- A consultation for you and your child with a Hanen Certified Speech-Language Pathologist/Therapist before the program begins
- A series of informative and personal classes for small groups of parents
- Three individual consultations with your Hanen Certified Speech-Language Pathologist/Therapist during which:
 - you discuss communication goals and specific strategies for your child
 - you are videotaped interacting with your child during an everyday activity. This video is then reviewed and discussed with you so you can “see” what is helping and what else you can do to help your child learn.

What Parents Learn:

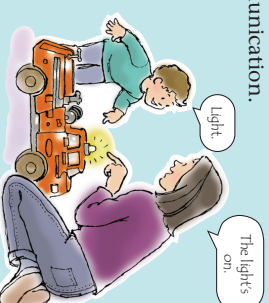
1. Let Your Child Lead

You’ll learn more about how your child expresses his feelings, needs and interests. You’ll learn how to get face to face with your child so you can OBSERVE what he’s doing, WAIT for him to communicate with you (with or without words) and LISTEN to what he is telling you.



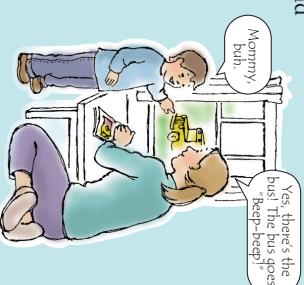
2. Follow Your Child's Lead

You’ll learn how to respond immediately to what your child tells you in ways that help him learn language. When you follow your child’s lead, you build his confidence and encourage even more communication.



3. Take Turns to Keep the Interaction Going

You’ll learn how to take turns back and forth and have simple conversations with your child. You’ll also learn how to adjust everyday routines that you and your child already enjoy to create more opportunities for interaction and communication.



4. Add Language to the Interaction

You’ll learn how to add words to the interaction to help your child express himself and learn about the world. You’ll also learn how to highlight words to make it easier for your child to learn and remember them.
